- The IIE Bachelor of Laws Degree will allow graduates to articulate into programmes at South African public or private higher education institutions, subject to the particular admission requirements of the institution applied to being met.
- The IIE Bachelor of Laws Degree is specifically intended to provide opportunities for vertical articulation into the IIE Master of Laws (LLM) Degree. This Degree is also designed to facilitate entry horizontally into appropriate Postgraduate Diplomas and similar vocationally orientated programmes.
- It is further envisaged that graduates from The IIE LLB Degree may enroll for Master's Degrees in non-law disciplines such as business (MBA's) or in the field of higher education. The Degree will also allow graduates to proceed to further study in an IIE Postgraduate Certificate or Diploma or Honours Degree available at Emeris.

Graduation and Completion Requirements for This Qualification

In order to be awarded this qualification, you must have achieved a minimum final year mark of fifty percent (50%) for all 33 modules in the curriculum.

As a distance (online) student, this qualification is structured to be completed over 4 years. The maximum time for completing a qualification full-time is double the minimum time associated with the qualification, and for part-time an additional year is allowed.

Where Assessments Are Written in Person

- For students based in South Africa, online students may select any Emeris campus as their Examination Centre.
- An alternative examination centre is only permissible for students studying abroad and those located in a province of South Africa where there is no IIE campus. If there is no IIE campus within reach, an alternative venue will need to be sourced by you. For non-IIE venues, there is an alternative venue levy per module.
