

Sport Bursary Terms & Conditions

There are three (3) Sport bursary categories:

- 1. National Sports Club
- 2. Discretionary Sport
- 3. Sports Club Administrator

Please see below the process related to offering and awarding of sports bursaries by Emeris:

- 1. In order for a sports bursary to be considered, a prospective student is required to be interviewed by a Student Advisor and complete the main Application & Pre-Registration process and make the relevant payment.
- 2. Students will need to submit a Sports CV, Sports Application Form and any evidence relating to sports bursary application.
- 3. If the student meets the requirements, a Provisional Bursary Offer letter will be issued to the prospective student
- 4. As stated in the Provisional Bursary Offer letter, the bursary is only applicable:
 - i. At the campus that issues the bursary offer letter
 - ii. For that specific academic year and qualification as indicated on the letter
- 5. The Provisional Bursary Offer will clearly outline all relevant and applicable T&Cs including the fact that the final bursary amount is subject to change based on the tuition fee and modules the student registers for.
- 6. If the student wishes to accept the bursary, the prospective student will be required to sign the Provisional Bursary Offer letter and submit the signed letter back to the campus that issued the letter.
- 7. A Bursary Confirmation letter with the final value of the bursary will only be issued once the student has been enrolled at Emeris and after all other bursaries and awards have been considered.
- 8. The student will then be required to sign an Individual Sponsorship Agreement which outlines the terms and conditions of the sports bursary.

9. Bursaries are awarded and reviewed on an annual basis, following a Mid-Year and Year-End Review, according to the Individual Sponsorship Agreement, at the discretion of Emeris.

All sports bursaries offered and awarded by Emeris are subject to the student meeting the following terms and conditions:

- 1. A full complement of modules must be registered for, as per the IIE program structure document, and if you are in your final year of completion, this must be a minimum of six (6) modules. Exceptions may be considered, and you are required to submit a motivation to your campus Sports Coordinator for final consideration.
- 2. This bursary excludes repeat modules and sports club fees and may not be transferred to any other person or redeemed for cash.
- 3. Where a student is eligible for more than one bursary (e.g. an academic merit bursary plus a sports bursary) the consolidated bursary amount cannot exceed the tuition fee for the programme.
- 4. If you fail to meet any academic entrance requirements in order to register as a student at Emeris, the bursary will be made null and void.
- 5. Subsequent to enrolment and the awarding of your bursary,
 - i. should your account fall into arrears and payments not be made according to the payment plan selected, Emeris reserves the right to cancel the bursary by reversing part, or the full bursary awarded.
 - ii. should you drop modules, your bursary awarded may be reduced or cancelled all together.
 - iii. should a registration contract be cancelled, the bursary will be reversed prior to the calculation of any penalties or fee portion owing. Normal cancellation rules apply as per the main registration contract.

6. Transfers:

Should a student transfer, campus A will reverse the full or partial bursary, dependent on when in academic year the transfer is processed. The student may apply for the Bursary at campus B, where they may still be eligible for the balance of the bursary where that the code of Sport is offered at Campus B.

7. There are additional requirements related to sporting performance, club membership affiliation, academic performance, medical obligations and public relations commitments that are specific to each sporting code and/or club. These individual requirements will be outlined in the Provisional Offer letter, Bursary Confirmation Letter and the Individual Sponsorship Agreement. These individual requirements will also need to be met in order for the bursary to be awarded.
