Qualification Description

The IIE Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education is an entry level/introductory qualification (at NQF Level 5). This one-year higher certificate is structured in accordance with The Department of Higher Education and Training's (DHET) Policy on Minimum Requirements for Programmes Leading to Qualifications in Higher Education for Early Childhood Development Educators (2017), and with the National Curriculum Framework (NCF) for Children from Birth to Four Policy (2015).

In addition, it is aligned to the HEQSF guidelines, and will provide students with the beginning knowledge, skills and applied competences identified to be critical for facilitation at this level. Graduates will be well prepared with insight and skills that both contribute to employability and are relevant to further specialisation study in support of the principles of life-long learning.

Who Is This Qualification Aimed At?

The IIE Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education is aimed at students passionate about the study of early childhood development (ECD) education from birth through to 4 years of age. It is intended to provide students with "basic introductory knowledge, cognitive and conceptual tools and practical techniques to enable further study in ECD" (DHET, 2017: 24).

On successful completion of this Higher Certificate in Early Childhood Care and Education (HC in ECCE), your certificate will be endorsed with LoLT (English). <p>LoCC:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> If you have an African Language (excluding Afrikaans) as part of your NSC or equivalent, you may be exempted for this language. If you are claiming conversational competence in an African Language (excluding Afrikaans), you are required to pass a competency test on NQF Level 5 in order to demonstrate conversational competence in such a language and be exempted for this language. Competency tests are offered in four (4) official languages only, namely, isiXhosa, isiZulu, Sepedi and Setswana on The IIE campuses. If conversational competence is claimed in another African language (excluding Afrikaans) other than the four listed above, the onus is on you to provide evidence of NQF Level 5, or higher conversational competence in that language. Once you have demonstrated conversational competence in an African language, and on successful completion of the HC in ECCE, your certificate will be endorsed, for example LoCC: isiZulu. <p>Note: Languages offered are campus dependent.</p>

Work Integrated Learning (i.e. ECD Experience - ECDX5112)

Early Childhood Experience is an integral part of any Early Childhood Care and Education programme and grants students an opportunity to work within an authentic Early Childhood Development (ECD) environment. Students will be required to complete a minimum of 6-weeks in work-integrated learning which comprises of both ECD Centre-based experiences and online supplementary activities. ECD Centre-based experience must take place in a suitable, registered South African ECD Centre (as determined by the institution).

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Access Into Work Integrated Learning (i.e. ECD Experience)

The HCECCE Student is required to meet specific criteria for entrance into the School/ECD Centre for ECD Experience.

The following is important in this regard:

Police Clearance Certificates

All HCECCE students are required to have a valid police clearance certificate on commencement of their ECD Centre-based Experience.

Access into ECD Centre-based Experience

Access into ECD Centre-based Experience will be conditional upon meeting both of the following requirements:

- 100% Attendance in the Teaching Experience Module Lecture Sessions.
- 100% Submission rate for all module assessments in modules aligned to ECD Experience.

Graduation and Completion Requirements for This Qualification

In order to be awarded this qualification, you must have achieved a minimum final year mark of fifty percent (50%) for all 9 modules in the curriculum.

As a contact student, this qualification is structured to be completed over 1 year. The maximum time for completing a qualification full-time is double the minimum time associated with the qualification, and for part-time an additional year is allowed.
